Since losing his right leg below the knee in a motorbike accident when he was 22, Peter Connell from Toowoomba had been forced to watch from the sidelines while his family engaged in his beloved pastime of boating and kayaking ,and subsequently missed out on the the valuable family bonding time that came with it.

This year, the NDIS funded a 'water leg' – a waterproof prosthetic leg – for Peter which has changed his life.

"One of my biggest dreams was to be able to reconnect with my family," Peter said.

"I have three boys and they are all young adults now, but one of them is still right into water sports. The water leg means I can go out kayaking with him and build that relationship."
