

















# 4.1 Total annualised committed support for active participants with an approved plan by support category (%)






# 4.2 Total annualised committed support for active participants with an approved plan by primary disability (%)





4.4 Total annualised committed support for active participants with an function score and an approved plan by level of function (%)




### 5. Average annualised committed support - most recent approved plans








5.2 Average annualised committed support for active participants with an approved plan by primary disability (\$)










### 7.5 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 0 - 6 yrs














# 7.21 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 15 to 24 yrs










# 7.29 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 25+ yrs


