




4.3 Total annualised committed support for active participants with an approved plan by age group (%)











4.4 Total annualised committed support for active participants with an function score and an approved plan by level of function (%)




5.2 Average annualised committed support for active participants with an approved plan by primary disability (\$)



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

7.5 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 0 - 6 yrs












### 7.22 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by primary disability for age 15 to 24 yrs









7.24 Total annualised committed support for active participants with an approved plan by support category for age 15 to 24 yrs






7.28 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by primary disability for age 25+ yrs
