




2.1 Age profile of participants with an approved plan (no. of participants)



2.2 Primary disability of participants with an approved plan




2.3 The level of function of participants with an approved plan










4.1 Total annualised committed support by support category (%)




4.2 Total annualised committed support by primary disability (%)



4.3 Total annualised committed support by age group (%)




4.4 Total annualised committed support by level of function (%)




5. Average annualised committed support - most recent approved plans




5.2 Average annualised committed support by primary disability (\$)











7.11 Distribution of participants by annualised committed support band for age 7 to 14 yrs




7.12 Total annualised committed support by support category for age 7 to 14 yrs





7.17 Distribution of participants by annualised committed support band for age 15 to 24 yrs




7.18 Total annualised committed support by support category for age 15 to 24 yrs







