



2.1 Age profile of participants with an approved plan (no. of participants)






2.3 The level of function of participants with an approved plan










4.2 Total annualised committed support by primary disability (%)



4.3 Total annualised committed support by age group (%)




4.4 Total annualised committed support by level of function (%)




5. Average annualised committed support - most recent approved plans




5.2 Average annualised committed support by primary disability (\$)





7.6 Total annualised committed support by support category for age 0-6 yrs







7.11 Distribution of participants by annualised committed support band for age 7 to 14 yrs




7.12 Total annualised committed support by support category for age 7 to 14 yrs





7.15 Distribution of participants by annualised committed support band for age 15 to 24 yrs






