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Annual pricing review (APR) for 2026-27 prices

We've released the annual pricing review (APR). It provides guidance on what we consider appropriate NDIS prices for 2026-27.

We've also released a pricing schedule. This provides guidance on appropriate prices for NDIS supports, including prices from the APR.

You can use the NDIS pricing schedule to help inform your prices from 1 July 2026. You must talk with participants about any proposed changes to existing service agreements. Participants must agree to these changes before they are made.

On 14 May 2026 the National Disability Insurance Scheme Amendment (Securing the NDIS for Future Generations) Bill 2026 (Bill) was introduced into Parliament. The Bill proposes to provide the Minister for the NDIS with the power to make a pricing determination.

This year's APR sets out guidance and views regarding appropriate NDIS prices. It is anticipated the APR will inform any advice provided by us to the Minister for the NDIS on pricing, if the Bill is subsequently passed.

Previous pricing updates

Pricing guidance updates – in effect 24 November 2025

We have updated our pricing guidance as part of our regular process to keep our documents up to date and in line with policy.

We listened to feedback from participants and providers who asked for earlier notice on updates to pricing changes.

These changes will come into effect on 24 November 2025.

Key changes include:

- Change to the recommended price for Art Therapists and Music Therapists as outlined in the Independent Review of Art and Music Therapies.
- Updates to the guidance for claiming of 'Other Professional' support items to align with recommendations of the Independent Review of Art and Music Therapies.
- Removal of the COVID Addendum and related support items.
- Implementation of the most recent Department of Health, Disability and Ageing updates to the Modified Monash Model classifications.
- Updates to the Specialist Disability Accommodation calculator as part of the annual process to index Specialist Disability Accommodation pricing following updates to the Disability Support Pension indexation.
- Updates to the NDIS price guidance documents including:
 - Creating, modifying and deleting support items in the Assistive Technology, Home Modifications and Consumables Code Guide.
 - Updating the descriptions of Community Social and Recreational Activities, Innovative Community Participation and Community Participation Activities items in the price guidance.

SDA updates – announced 30 June 2025

The NDIS Pricing Arrangements for Specialist Disability Accommodation 2025-26 has been released.

These prices are effective from 1 July 2025.

Price guidance updates – announced 16 June 2025

The updated NDIS pricing guidance has been published, following the release of the 2024-25 Annual Pricing Review (APR) recommendations.

The pricing updates come into effect on 1 July 2025. The NDIA has made further price guidance updates, in addition to the APR recommendations.

- Changing the early childhood age limit from 7 to 9 years old.
- The early childhood approach now covers children up to 9 years old.
- New text added to explain provider responsibilities and conflicts of interest.

This explains a provider's duty to declare and manage any conflict of interest.

APR updates – announced 11 June 2025

Today, the NDIA released the outcomes of the 2024-25 Annual Price Review.

The NDIA is committed to implementing a range of reforms to help shape an NDIS marketplace that is fair, equitable and sustainable.

The 2024-25 APR is laying the groundwork for the NDIS marketplace of the future.

High Intensity Supports update – announced 1 October 2024

Starting from 1 October 2024, providers may claim Intensive and Complex Behaviour Supports at the same price as High Intensity Supports.

This change addresses concerns that arose when the term “challenging behaviours” was removed from the High Intensity Support definition in pricing guidance.

This applies to:

- Assistance with Daily Life Tasks in a Group or Shared Living Arrangement
- Daily Personal Activities
- Participation in Community, Social and Civic Activities
- Group and Centre Based Activities

In line with general claiming rules, providers must:

1. Provide behaviour support that are in line with participant's plans.
2. Be registered and assessed for Module 2A by 30 June 2025, or
3. Apply for registration (new or amended) with a completed Module 2A audit by 30 June 2025.

Plain English APR – announced 17 September 2024

The NDIA have released a plain English version of the 2023-24 Annual Pricing Review (APR).

APR and price guidance updates – announced 28 June 2024 ?

The National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA) has announced guidance about what the Agency considers to be appropriate and reasonable maximum prices, ahead of proposed broader reforms that will strengthen the NDIS provider market.

This year, the recommendations include the following:

- Fully implementing the Fair Work Commission's decision to increase minimum wages in awards and superannuation.

- Adjusting price guidance for supports that are determined by the NDIS DSW Cost Model, including Level 1 support coordination services, to reflect changes in the minimum wages following the Fair Work Commission's Annual Wage Review.
- New recommended prices for psychologists, nurses and other supports based on how much wages and the cost of living have gone up.
- Maintaining existing pricing arrangements and price limits for therapy (except for psychologists) and support coordination level 2 and 3.
- Adjusting short-notice cancellation period for non-Disability Support Worker-related supports to 2 business days to better reflect market norms.
