All NDIS participants aged 16 years and over are eligible for the COVID-19 Pfizer vaccine.

From Wednesday 25 August, children aged 12 to 15 in the below groups will also be eligible to receive a Pfizer vaccine:

- NDIS participants and/or those living with significant disability requiring frequent assistance with activities of daily living. This includes:
 - down syndrome
 - muscular dystrophy
 - o traumatic brain and spinal cord injury
 - severe intellectual disability
- those with specified medical conditions (severe asthma, diabetes, obesity, cardiac circulatory congenital anomalies, epilepsy and those who are immunocompromised)
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children aged 12 to 15 years old
- all children aged 12 to 15 in remote communities, as part of broader community outreach vaccination programs.

A vaccination will help protect you and your community. It's free and voluntary. A COVID-19 vaccine will help to protect yourself, your family and people you care for.
